Democratic Party Meeting  
February 25, 2021, 7:00 PM (virtual meeting-ZOOM)  
Minutes

The meeting was opened shortly before 7:00 PM, and participants began logging in. The meeting began about ten minutes past seven. Chair Hawley welcomed participants, and First Vice Chair Joyah Bulluck presented Inspirational Thoughts and led in a Moment of Silence. Taylors Precinct Chair George Revis then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Without objection, the proposed agenda (previously distributed by email) was adopted, and also the minutes from our last meeting on January 28, 2021 (previously distributed by email) were adopted.

There were very brief officers' reports, including the report of the Party Treasurer, Tom Sallenger, who noted that our current checking account balance is \$9,486.94.

Nancy Hawley, Co-President of the Democratic Women of Wilson County, then provided a report from that auxiliary. DWWC is in the midst of their Membership Drive, and encouraged people to join. She announced the next three programs for DWWC Meetings for March, April, and May (Public Education, Prevention of Gun Violence, and Immigration Facts and Law). She also noted that DWWC has about ten of their Commemorative Calendars honoring Wilson County Women still available, at a discounted price of ten dollars each.

House District 24 Representative Linda Cooper-Suggs then brought greetings and updates on legislative actions. She is continuing to provide excellent communication to her constituents and keep in contact with us.

The rest of the meeting was focused on planning and considering details for the upcoming Annual Precinct Organization meetings, which must be completed within the fourteen day period of Saturday, March 6, 2021, and Saturday, March 20.

A schedule of ZOOM meetings of Precinct clusters was presented. With 24 precincts across the county, we can arrange four ZOOM events, each dedicated to six precincts. Since our precincts vary dramatically in size and number of delegates to be elected, we planned to group so that each cluster includes a roughly similar total size of participants.

We will plan and schedule these events, and send registration links to Democrats across the county. Those who are willing and able to attend their Precinct meeting can complete the

registration link, and they will be sent a message including the actual log-in link to the meeting. **It is important to note that this is a two-step process:** the first step is to complete the Precinct Meeting Registration form and submit that. The second step is to receive the confirmation email, and **save the provided log-in link**, which will take participants to their Precinct Cluster Meeting.
